



CHURCH PLANTING INTERNATIONAL 2022 MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Peru

- **Church planting:** Our native missionary partners were sent on over 20 mission trips to jungle communities where seven churches are being planted. Two churches are also being planted in Lima. CPI helped with church construction in three communities, and a home was purchased to serve as a base for church planting among the Yaminahuas (an unreached people) in the remote jungle village of Breu.
- **Leadership training:** CPI workers have started four training centers in Peru. Classes were conducted in these schools ten times involving about 75 students from five Amazon tribes. Eleven students graduated from the Word of Grace Bible Institute at CPI's jungle center. Two retreats were held for CPI workers with over 150 books distributed.
- **Financial support of native missionaries:** Six native missionaries were regularly supported to plant churches and conduct training.
- **Humanitarian outreach** included food, medicines, emergency dental, emergency childbirth, and investment in a small business.
- **CPI missionaries Casey and Giuly Kidd** continued full-time work with the Matses and Shipibo tribes in the Amazon jungles conducting eight training missions.

Mexico

- Monthly support was provided for the widow of the founder of the church in the Huichol village of Guadalupe.
- Two visits were conducted to the Guadalupe church.

Uganda

- **Church planting:** CPI is involved with 12 churches in three areas of Uganda, seven of which are being planted in communities where there is no other church. CPI also helped with two church constructions, and helped to establish a leadership team and board for a church in Kampala.
- **Leadership training:** CPI sponsored leadership training conferences in four communities that were conducted by our Ugandan partners, and CPI supported seven students to receive biblical training in Ugandan Bible institutes.
- **Support of native missionaries:** Support was provided for several strategic purposes, including a motorcycle for a church planter who was walking ten miles to church.
- **Humanitarian outreach** included a school lunch program for over 300 children, funding for four surgeries and two childbirths, plus assistance with other medical needs, dental, food, clothing, bedding, educational expense, monthly support of a widow, and Christmas offerings for families of 16 pastors.

Myanmar, Southeast Asia

- CPI continued support of church planter Abraham Piang, and provided a motorcycle for his work among Buddhists, Hindus, and Muslims.



CPI'S 2023 GOALS

Peru

- Continue the financial support of CPI's four Shipibo missionaries for their work in evangelism, church planting, and leadership training, with a special focus upon planting new churches in unchurched communities.
- Assist and financially support Otoniel Pardo's teaching and church planting ministry in Lima, and Cesar Soto's work among the Yaminahuas, the Yora, and with *Misión CPI*.
- Through CPI missionary Casey Kidd and native partners, conduct at least 3-4 weeks of training at each of the four training institutes in the Peruvian jungles.
- Strengthen church plants among the Shipibos on the Ucayali River. Support at least two missions to remote jungle communities of both the Yaminahuas and Yoras.
- Conduct a combination retreat and outreach in June at the CPI Center, involving *Misión CPI* co-workers from both the jungles and Lima.
- Continue to help with urgent humanitarian needs in Peru.

Mexico

- Continue to financially support Azucena to labor in the Huichol village of Guadalupe where there is still no pastor. Provide opportunities for biblical training for Azucena's daughter and the young Huichol leader Elian Chavez.
- In February visit Guadalupe to conduct training. Send Mexican co-workers to encourage the work in Guadalupe.



Uganda

- Continue to support the church planting efforts of Isaac Mugisa in the mountains of western Uganda, Richard Kutosi in eastern Uganda, and in Kampala through the leadership team of the Calvary Worship Center.
- Continue to support the work of John Kivamunda to provide biblical training for church leaders at his two training centers and at Calvary Worship Center. Develop additional training materials for the churches.
- Continue to provide school lunches for the 300 children and 15 staff of the God's Mercy School in west Uganda.
- Continue monthly support of Grace, Pastor Michael's widow, and help with urgent humanitarian needs such as food, shelter, and medical care.

Myanmar

- Continue support of church planter Abraham Piang, and help with food distribution to the needy.

CPI

- Continue to train Matthew Shepard to work with CPI and introduce daughter Sarah Smith to the work in Peru.
